Cancer is a common and costly workforce health condition

1 in 3 women and 1 in 2 men will get cancer during their lifetime, and an estimated 1.9 million Americans received a new cancer diagnosis in 2021 alone. The U.S. population of cancer survivors now exceeds 15 million – and about half of them are of working age. So it's not surprising that 80% of employers say cancer is their top employee health care concern and cost driver.

Nearly a quarter of employers' total health care costs go toward cancer treatment.4

Cancer is a top cost driver for businesses⁵

Of all the serious diseases impacting employee health, the highest proportion of employer health care costs – an average of 22% – is spent on cancer treatment.⁶ This doesn't include lost time from work or other indirect costs – which make up over half of employers' total cancer-related expenses.⁷ And even after cancer treatment is complete, annual health care costs are twice as high for cancer survivors than for employees who have never had cancer.⁸

Annual health care costs are 2x as high for employees with a history of cancer¹⁰

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

Connected health records – Each member's cancer care journey is captured in their electronic health record. So care teams can easily share information to help optimize treatment and ongoing care.

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

At least 42% of cancer cases can be prevented.¹² And finding cancer early is proven to increase survival rates and decrease costs. In fact, treatment for early-stage cancer costs 2 to 4 times less than treatment for more advanced cancer.¹³

Individualized prevention – Genetic risk assessment helps care teams understand employees' risk for hereditary cancers and proactively tailor preventive care and screening plans accordingly. No need for costly third-party genetic counseling or other services – it's built into our care.



Individualized treatment – Each cancer patient gets their own unique screening plan, treatment plan, diagnostic map, and survivorship plan. It's all captured in our electronic health record so care teams can collaborate on treatment and patients can access this information anytime.


